Keep Lane Changes to a Minimum By: Chris Haney

- Pick a lane and STAY in it.
- Cars will dodge and change lanes no matter what. If you do find it necessary to change lanes, move over very carefully, be aware of your blind spots and constantly check your mirrors.
- The odds of an accident increases dramatically each time a vehicle makes a move to another lane. In the event of an accident, if you have maintained your lane position, the other vehicle will most likely be at fault, not you.
- When entering a city from the freeway, take the 2nd lane from the right, to avoid merging vehicles. Cars love to hug the right lane and dodge all over. They tend not to merge.
 Merging seems to be a 'lost art'.

5 Tips for a Safer Driver By: Chuck Koch

- 1. *Eyes should be on the road:* Always be alert while driving a truck and try to look ahead on the road. This allows you time to anticipate what is going on ahead of you. It is always better to act on something than it is to react to a situation.
- 2. *Maintain safe distance:* Always maintain safe distance with other small vehicles on the roads. Controlling the space in front of you gives you more time to react if an accident happens and allows you time to avoid a collision.
- 3. *Continuously check mirrors:* Drivers should always be aware of what is going on around them. Continuously check mirrors while driving so that you know what lanes and positions are open if something was to happen in front of you.
- 4. *GPS should be on:* If you're not familiar with the area you should route plan before you leave and make sure your trucking GPS is taking you on the correct truck route. Use this time to make sure that you're being routed on legal routes for your weight and size.
- 5. *Examine weather reports:* You should always be aware of the weather reports for the area that you will be driving and working in. This will allow you to prepare for possible adverse traffic conditions and delays.
